Meeting Minutes

Poultney Board of Selectmen

Monday, May 22, 2017 – 6:30 PM

Poultney Town Hall

Jeff King called the meeting to order. Selectmen present included: Jeff King, Frank Fressie, Tom Coloutti, Terry Williams and George Miller. Others present included Paul A. Donaldson, Town Manager, Ron Kelly, Highway Foreman, Neisja Crawford, Secretary / Bookkeeper

<u>Adoption of the Agenda:</u> Tom Coloutti made a motion to adopt the agenda. Terry Williams seconded the motion. Motion carried

Approval of Minutes: George Miller made a motion to approve the minutes of 5/8/17. Tom Coloutti seconded the motion. Motion carried

Public Comments and Concerns:

Legion Riders Motorcycle Club:

Deb McMurry: requesting approval to take the old flagpole that stood at Stonebridge and erect at the St. Raphael's Cemetery

The pole was badly damaged in the 2014 wind storm -Walt (Village maintenance crew) said he thought the remains of the pole were in the cellar of Stonebridge

Paul Donaldson: said he's been in the cellar and does not recall seeing the pole

-you'll need to contact Karen Atwood, head of the Cemetery, for permission to place the pole there

Jeff King: if the remains of the pole are still in storage, how does the board feel?

Tom Coloutti made a motion to give the Legion Riders the flag pole. Terry Williams seconded the motion. Motion carried

George Miller: Does Town normally give the Legion money?

Jeff King: Town gives \$1,000 for Memorial Day flags

Tom Coloutti: flag at Town office looks like it's ready to be replaced

Paul Donaldson: talk to Betsy Wescott, the Clerks Office takes care of the flag

Tom Coloutti: what about a POW flag for the month of May, and can they hang from

the same pole?

Terry Williams: ask Betsy

Fank Fressie to George Miller: does the Legion have any extra flags from funerals

George Miller: flags for funerals are received from the Vt Dept of Military Affairs

Tom Coloutti made a motion to purchase new flag for the Town Hall flag pole. George

Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried

Road Report:

Ron Kelly reported the following:

1) milk truck hit bridge no. 2 on Rt 140

- the bridge is on the accelerated bridge repair program
- contacted District 3 structure representative to look at, but have not heard back from yet
- presently on the Spring 2018 work schedule (hope to start sooner)
- need to jack-hammer some ledge, must contact Agency of Natural Resources, River Management
- 2) on-going grading
 - Leap Frog Nursery School for Community Day
 - installed wider shoulder on Rt 140 right hand side toward Middletown
 Springs -shored up with slate products

Tom Coloutti: Did Josh Cargill look at?

Ron Kelley: yes

Morse Hollow Rd

Tom Coloutti: did you work on culvert

Ron Kelly: started right next to it – going to have to work in the river, called

Agency of Natural Resources – guard rail hanging in mid air Paul Donaldson: Morse Hollow Rd was an emergency repair

3) Tom Beatty is working for the Town again.

-paying him \$16.40 for expertise none of us have

Terry Williams: What are you going to do when you don't have him anymore?

Ron Kelley: -Richard Ferguson can't run, he operates back-hoe

-the conversion valve is \$8,000

Terry Williams: how old is the machine?

Ron Kelly: 1995, purchased about 4 – 5 years ago, paid \$25,000

Tom Coloutti: track or wheels?

Ron Kelly: track

Paul Donaldson: should we put money in budget to change controls?

4) Replaced culverts at East Road, Clark Hollow

Tom Coloutti: -and look at East Poultney Rd on the store side

Town Managers Report:

Planning Commission hearings re: revisions to zoning bylaws:

Paul Donaldson: working with Neal Vreeland to set date

called Bob Williams

still have not seen the petition

 Ms. Silverman, neighbor, Hilltop Slate, looked at and does appear to be in violation

Fire Truck Purchase:

Paul Donaldson: reluctant to order if not sure have funding

- showed to Neal Vreeland- reluctant to give opinion
- called VLCT- no contingency financing

Terry Williams: are they still holding?

Paul Donaldson: yes, lease company, building company and Aaron Kerber- all pushing to go ahead

-Frank Fressie and Tom Coloutti were not present at the last meeting- talked with, and both agree that we should proceed if sure financing is good

Delinquent Tax Collection:

collection attorneys:

- talked to another attorney

-can do only 20 at a time

- the other firm will take on all

Tom Coloutti: how long?

Paul Donaldson: will take about 3 months, then get 20 more

-Same process- send letter

-cost \$25 per letter

- first firm was \$75 / hour, paralegal rate and 15%
- this firm only charges out of pocket, if nobody buys at tax sale and if the Town doesn't buy properties, then this attorney doesn't get paid

Frank Fressie: how are people to get a letter to be determined?

Paul Donaldson: attorney wants Town to have a policy

Frank Fressie: there should be a degree of equality amongst everyone

Jeff King: agreed

Terry Williams: where is this cost coming out of the budget?

Jeff King: 15% comes out of collected delinquent taxes

 like to get documentation from second attorney so we can make a decision at the next meeting

Jeff King: any news on crosswalks?

Paul Donaldson: it is Village- requesting grant money to assist with crosswalk- did webinar-Elizabeth Kyhill willing to help

Zoning:

Paul Donaldson: presently working on 5 – 6 applications

two instances where people want fill from Town
 Town issued permit

The Town is participating and people are cooperating

Terry Williams: is anyone checking to see if a state permit is required?

- Is it certified clean fill?
- Are we violating some state law?

Paul Donaldson: if it is near water or on top of a neighbor

Health Officer:

Terry Williams no report

Paul Donaldson: talked with Vinnie Covino

- gave go ahead to get iPad and yearly subscription for word, cost about \$400

Executive Session:
