Public Comments and Concerns:

Regional Marketing Initiative presentation, Mary Cohen and Lyle Jepson

- -Presentation addressed issues of declining population and shrinking workforce in Rutland County and marketing strategy to improve economy
- -Census Projection for Poultney showing continuing decrease in population
 - -older population is increasing and younger population is decreasing
- -selected a marketing firm to promote tourism, increase population of young working people and retain college students
- -looking for people from Poultney to join the Quality of Life Committee (4 6 meeting per year)
- asking for contribution of \$1.00 per resident
- -Chamber annual meeting is October 19, 2017
- -Paul Donaldson: Has there been an initiative to fill the many vacant buildings?

Have there been any efforts in vocational and hard sciences education?

- Lyle Jepson: "I taught Tech Ed for many years".
 - -Jon Muise is the USDA Acting State Director of Rural Development

- -There are promotional grant opportunities
- -Jeff King: I'd like to look into this more
- -Terry Williams: we need someone from the Town to get involved
- -Frank Fressie: look at Stowe Vermont, they've done very well promoting themselves

Terry Williams, discussion re: intersection of Ruby, High and Upper Roads, traffic control signage

Terry Williams: my garage was hit, people speed all the time

- there is a traffic study (need to find)

Road Report:

Paul Donaldson reported the following for Ron Kelley:

- started putting up winter sand
- prices of winter salt decreased about \$10/ton
- now offering pre-treated salt (going to try this year)
- worked on Griffen Road

Paul Donaldson: I'll ask Ron about doing some more mowing on a few roads

Town Managers Report:

 - Jeff King: there are no roads in Poultney open to ATV's
 - -Finel Hollow Bridge Necessity / Compensation Hearing, William Ringer

- -AOT pushed to repair work to 2019
- -Finel Hollow Bridge, Barbara Blaess, death
 - -with the passing of Barbara Blaess, now definitely looking at a later date
 - never formalized the easement deed
 - now will go to probate court
 - still aiming for the summer of 2019

Paul Donaldson: Now we need to do something to the bridge

- will call AOT to see what we can do

Terry Williams: Send letter to the Governor

Frank Fressie: We have a Legislature:

- we need to put our Representatives to work for us
- Representatives should be dealing with AOT
- send formal request to Pattie McCoy and Peg Flory (and all others)

Paul Donaldson: I will draft a letter from the Chairman of the Board

- -Project Work Safe, second visit scheduled for 9-20-17
 - first visit went through Town Garage, nothing major found
 - second visit will go through Fire House and Town Hall
 - when the second visit is complete, we will receive a written report with time frame to complete all items

Transact Any Other Lawful Business:

- -Jonas Rosenthal discussion about how criminal offences are prioritized
 - -Town is having more issues (possibly with same people)
 - -follow-up with current cases (is the State's Attorney's Office going to prosecute)
